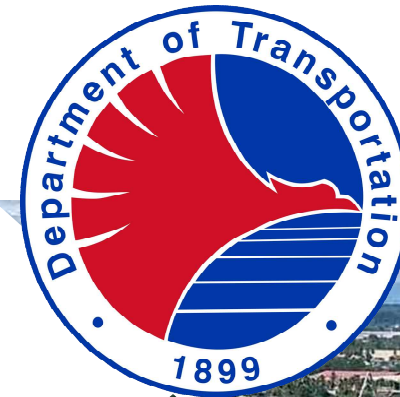


STRATEGY MAP

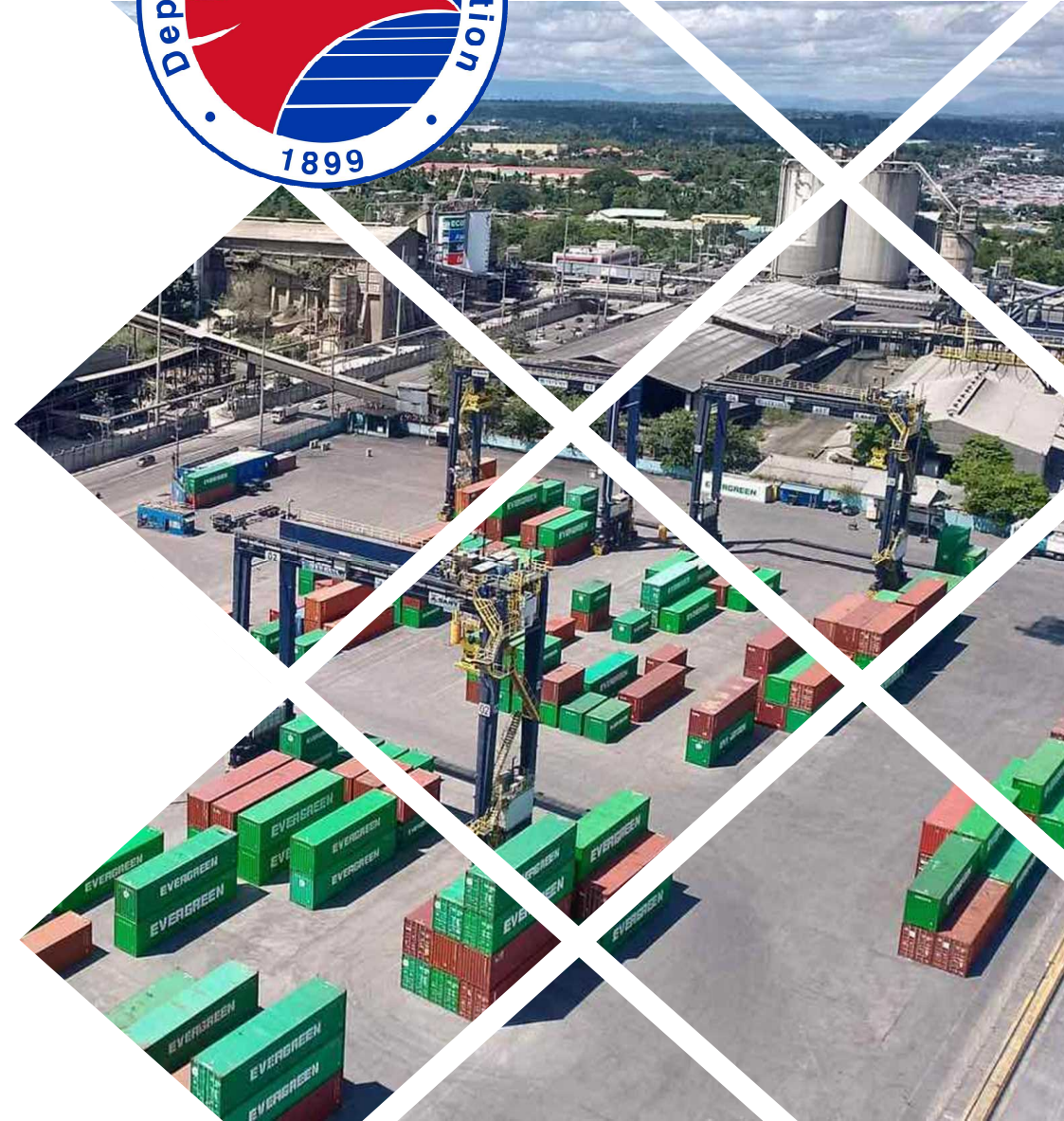
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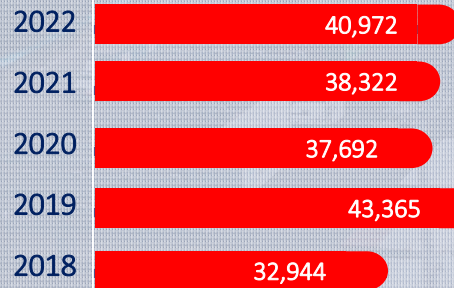

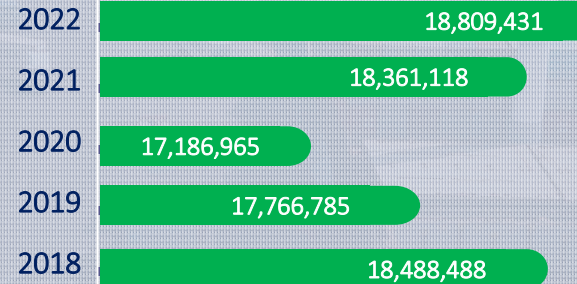
DAVAO REGION, PHILIPPINES (2018-2022)



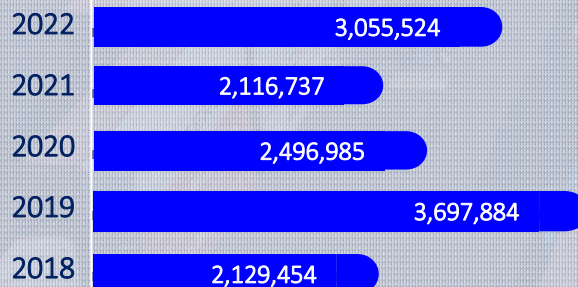
SHIPCALLS 2022 – 40,972



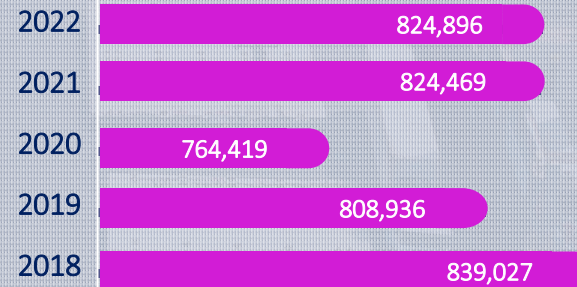
CARGO VOLUME 2022 – 18,809,431 MT



PASSENGER TRAFFIC 2022 – 3,055,524



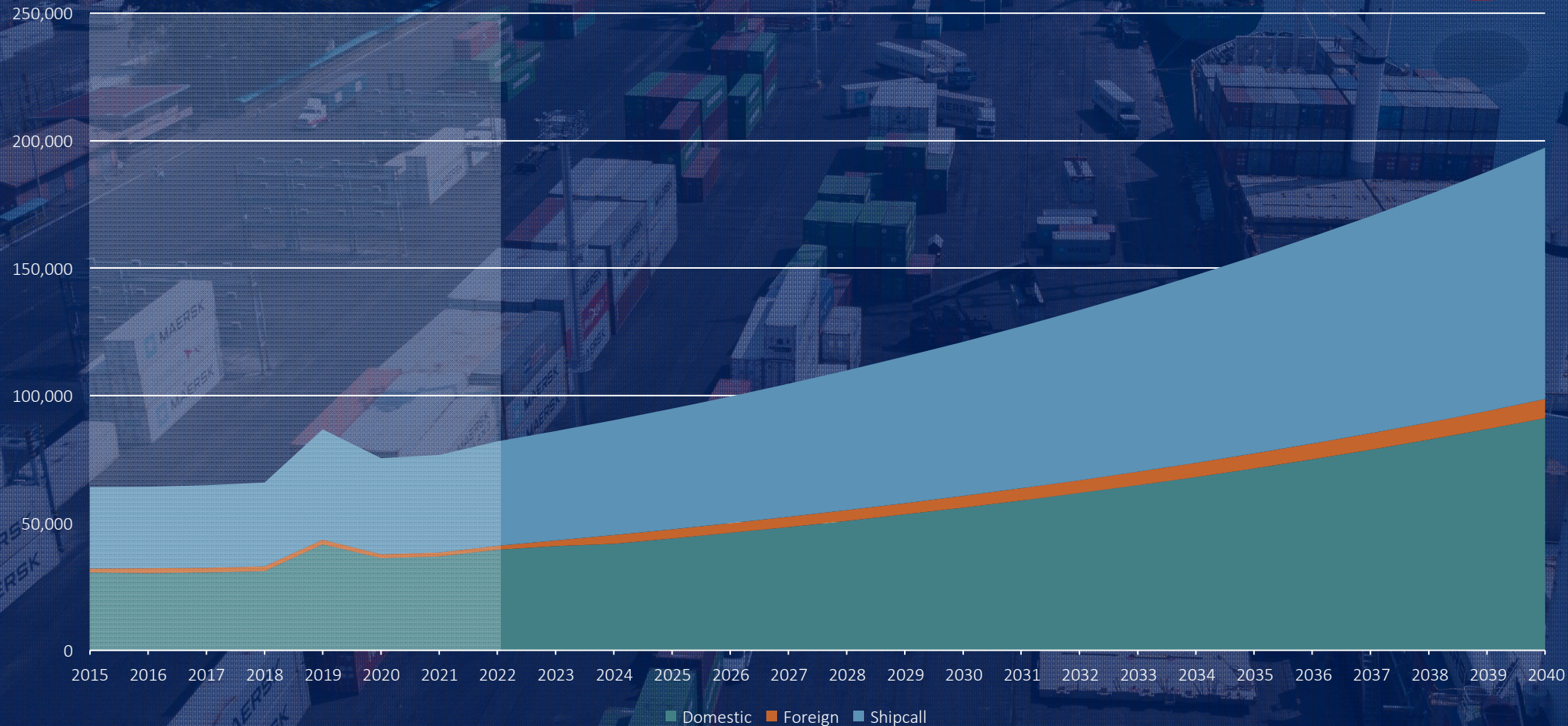
CONTAINER TRAFFIC 2022 – 824,896 TEUs

DAVAO REGION, PHILIPPINES (2015-2040)

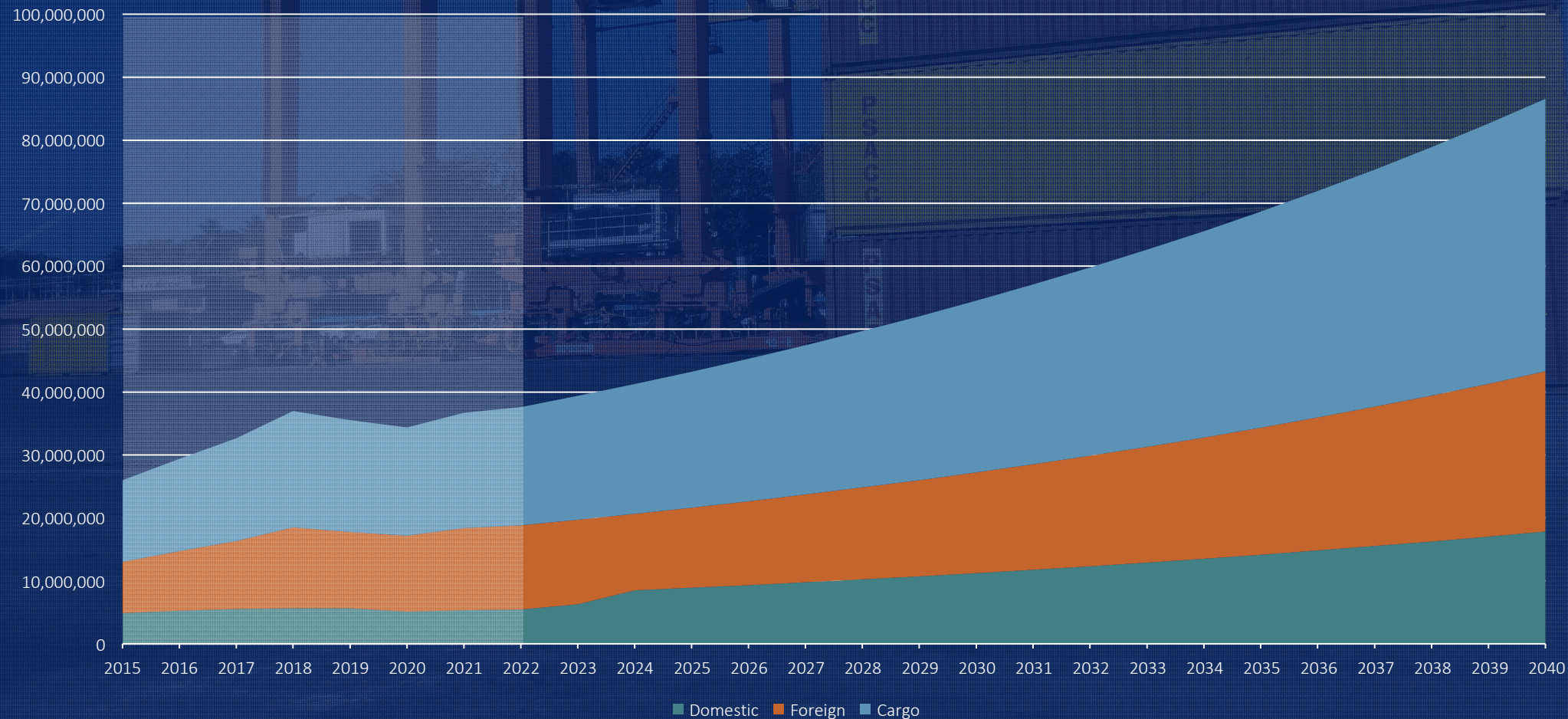

2040 – 43,278,022 MT

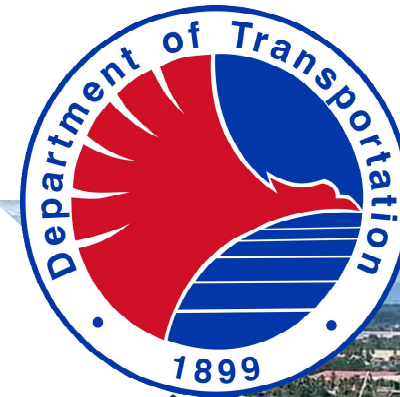
